### **OVERVIEW**

The DNP program is a rigorous advanced practice clinical doctorate which re ects the evolution and development of professional nursing<sup>1</sup> The program has two entrance points<sup>1</sup> Students who have completed a bachelog s degree in nursing ma enter at the post baccalaureate program<sup>1</sup> As part of the post baccalaureate program students will be prepared as either a nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist<sup>1</sup> The post baccalaureate entr program is a minimum of 62 credits and three ears of full time stud <sup>1</sup> Students interested in the post baccalaureate program should consult the admission criteria for the master s program in nursing<sup>1</sup>

Those students who have a master s degree in nursing and advanced speciali ation as a nurse practitioner clinical nurse specialist nurse midwife or nurse anesthetist ma enter the post master s program. The post master s entry program is a 33 credit two ear program of full time stud '

## **PROGRAM DESIGN**

The DNP program provides both full and part time options for stud ' Courses are held on weekda evenings during the fall spring and summer semesters' A student who chooses the full time option can complete the 33 credit hour post masters program in six semesters' A part time student who takes two courses per semester can complete the post masters program in seven semesters'
