

# EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. School of Education's educational leadership programs are designed for candidates who hold a New York state (NYS) teaching certificate and a master's degree, and are seeking NYS certification at the school building and school district level.

Using an integrated approach by combining theory, authentic case studies, class discussions, candidates' experience, and internships, the programs address current and emerging issues impacting the quality of education. The curriculum infuses theory with practice to support candidates to obtain the skills, knowledge, and values necessary to create optimum school conditions. In addition, the case studies and clinical experiences both teach and measure candidate competence against national and state standards.

## ACCREDITATION

The Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. School of Education is accredited based on the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) Standards through 2026.

Formerly the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), CAEP is the sole nationally recognized accrediting body for educator preparation, and is recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.

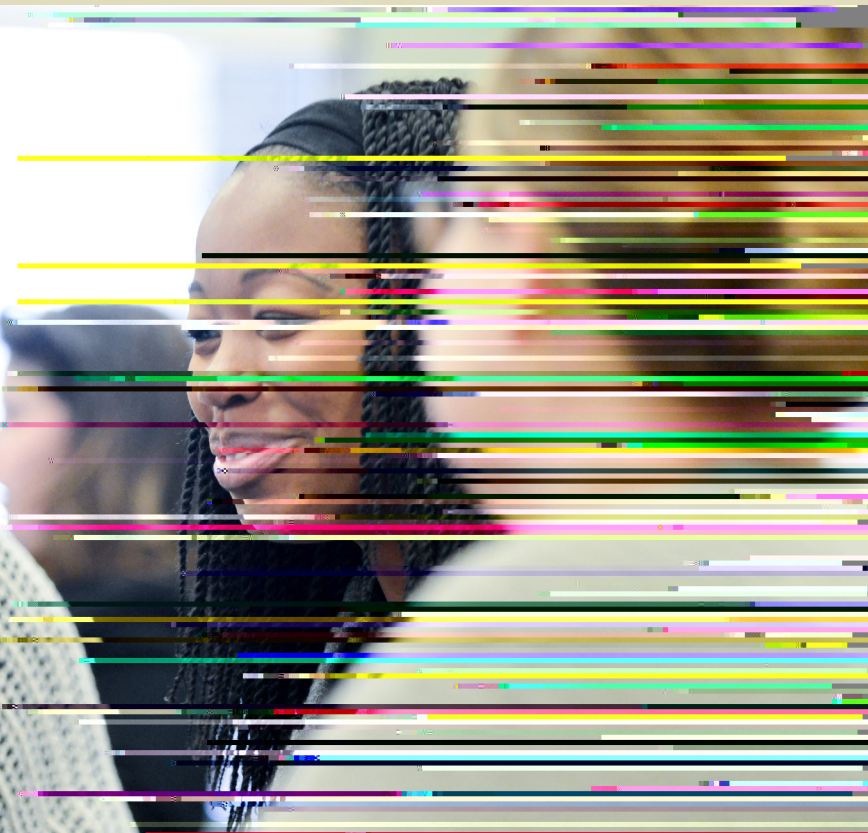

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Completed online application
- Baccalaureate and master's degrees from an accredited college or university
- Official transcripts of all undergraduate and graduate work (if applicable)
- Two recommendation forms (submitted online)
- Current résumé
- Professional/career goals statement
- Results of the TOEFL (if native language is not English)
- Graduate Transfer Credit Request Form and supporting documents (submitted online)
- A copy of New York state professional/permanent teaching certification OR proof of pending certification is required for students just completing their undergraduate studies.
- Applicants must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 for baccalaureate degrees from approved postsecondary institutions.
- Three years of experience in P-12 schools by completion of the program
